PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Property Committee continues to be very busy. Recent projects have included:

- Weekly cleaning of our entire facility.
- The latch on the outside door lock in the Pastor's Study was secured.
- Loose wiring under the sanctuary was tacked up.
- The church power washer is being serviced so as to be ready for cleaning our siding this summer.
- The sanctuary spotlight over the pulpit was replaced with LED bulbs and the angle was adjusted for proper highlighting.
- The group effort of church members and our scout troop accomplished spring clean- up of church property in time for Big Flats annual brush pick-up.
 The goal is to make this an annual event, accumulating brush in the trees over the summer and fall until the following spring.

Upcoming projects include:

- Flat roof repair to solve the intermittent leak problem.
- Kitchen and Church Street entry locks will be re-furbished / re-keyed.
- Both parking lots will be sealed.
- A window air conditioner will be purchased and installed in the Pastor's Office.
- Summer mowing and outdoor maintenance is underway.

A number of our projects will be costly (especially the roof and parking lot work), but are extremely important. Any and all contributions to our Building Fund will be gratefully received. Thank you for your support!

DOOR LOCKS TO BE REPLACED

A number of our key-holders have experienced problems with our kitchen and Church Street entrance doors. To address this situation, we have contracted with a local locksmith to refurbish and re-key the locks and to make new keys. The work is scheduled to be done on Monday, May 6.

Because of the re-keying process, **current keys will no longer work in the new locks**. These keys may be discarded after May 6. Anyone who needs to possess a key to our facility should see **Property Chairman Pat Fitzgerald** to get one of the new keys. **Jenny Dean**, who lives across from our church, will always have a key available for anyone who needs access to the building.

SHARED BLESSINGS NEWS

Our Shared Blessings mission outreach program has announced plans for a joint project. We will be working with the congregation of the Hillview United Methodist Church to fund and create "UMCOR Kits." These Layette Kits and Birthing Kits will be distributed by the United Methodist Committee on Relief. We are asking for donations of supplies and/or money to help produce as many kits as we can. **Ann Slowik** can answer any questions you may have about this project. Thanks, in advance, for your support. A listing of kit needs appears below.

UMCOR KIT REQUIREMENTS

Important Notes

- All items must be new.
- DO NOT wash any of the items as they will be considered used. Please remove all packaging.
- All emergency kits are carefully planned to make them usable in the greatest number of situations. Since strict
 rules often govern product entry into international countries, it is important that kits contain only the requested
 items nothing more.
- DO NOT include any personal notes, money or additional material in the kits. These things must be painstakingly removed and will delay the shipment.

Layette Kit Items

- 6 cloth diapers pre-folded or plain diapers only no disposable diapers
- 2 shirts undershirts or onesies
- 2 wash cloths infant size only no adult wash cloths
- 2 gowns or sleepers
- 2 diaper pins must have protective plastic closures no regular safety pins
- 1 sweater or jacket must open from the front may be hand knitted, crocheted or sewn hooded sweatshirts are acceptable
- 2 receiving blankets 30" x 30" or 30" x 32" sizes only no crib blankets please

Assembling Directions

Lay one of the receiving blankets flat on a table. Set aside the diaper pins and place all remaining items on top of the blanket. Fold the blanket around the items and secure the bundle with the diaper pins. Attach \$2 per kit for postage.

Birthing Kit Items

- 1 small bar soap 1 oz. to 2 oz. size do not remove from original packaging small bars such as those found in hotels are acceptable
- 1 pair sterile gloves surgical, latex or thin rubber gloves are acceptable
- 1 square yard of clear plastic sheeting must be 4 millimeters thick plastic trash bags and shower curtains are not acceptable
- 3 12-inch long pieces of cotton string must be clean secure the pieces of string by bundling and tying them together - no yarn please
- **1 single edge razor** must be covered in paper or cardboard to keep it from causing injury regular shaving razors are not acceptable
- 2 receiving blankets 30"x 30" or 32"x 32" size no thermal or fleece blankets please
- 1 plastic bag one-gallon size sealable bags only

Assembling Directions

Fold the plastic sheeting and blankets so they will fit easily into the plastic bag. Lay the loose items on top of the blankets and plastic sheeting. Slide all items into the plastic bag. Squeeze as much air out of the bag and then seal it. Attach \$2 per kit for postage.
