SUPER SUPPERS: This is the second year for a series of fund-raising meals which endeavors to provide a delicious meal each month (Dec. – Feb.) at a reasonable price. Meals are served from **5:00-7:00 PM on the second Wednesday** of each month, with the cost set at **\$8.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children**. Take-out meals are also available. Our kickoff meal in November was a Meatloaf Supper, followed by a Chicken Pot-Pie Dinner in December. Our next dinner, set for **January 8**, will feature Roast Beef, and we will close our season with Roast Turkey on **February 12**.

PANCAKE BREAKFASTS: Well into our ninth season, our fund-raising Pancake Breakfasts continue to be a big hit! Enthusiastic patrons have flocked to our Church House for gourmet breakfasts of pancakes, eggs, sausage, fruit cup, and beverages. Our next two breakfasts are scheduled for **Saturday, January 11, and Saturday, February 8, from 8:00 - 10:00 AM.** The cost for each meal has been set at **\$6.00**. There is no charge for those under six years old.

Our congregation responded with great generosity to our 2019 Advent mission drives. Our "Shower for Mary" is an important effort which helps victims of domestic abuse at the Elmira Salvation Army's Safehouse, and our "Gifts for Joseph" program helps men (and families) served by the Catholic Charities Samaritan Center. Both of these drives were extremely successful, overflowing a station wagon with donated items on delivery day! We also had a number of monetary donations.

Thank you to all who participated in this vital outreach. Special thanks to our Mission Committee for a generous cash donation to both these programs.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT

Recent Property Committee projects have included:

- Our water softener was replaced with a refurbished unit. This has resulted in improved water pressure and water quality. Chemung Softwater, of Elmira, did this work at a discounted price resulting in considerable savings (over \$1000!) to our church budget.
- We have been monitoring our heating system and have had to replace couplers in one of our pump motors.
- Volunteers from Scout Troop #87 and members of our Property Committee and congregation completed our fall property cleanup.
- Our snow shoveling team has worked to stay ahead of two recent snow and ice events.
- We have contracted with Ed Rhodes to upgrade the lighting in our Church House, Kitchen, and Office areas.
 Fluorescent fixtures will be converted to LED lighting.
- Pat and Tom Seem coordinated Christmas decorations and lighting.
- Property members periodically check our flat roof to make sure that drains are free of debris.
- Volunteers from our Property Committee clean our sanctuary, restrooms, kitchen, offices, and social areas each week. Additional help is always welcome (see Sheila French).
- Each month we give continued attention to our scheduled maintenance list items.
