#### PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Property Committee continues to be very busy. Recent projects have included:

- Installed a new sanctuary circulating pump motor in our boiler room.
- Monitored gas and electric power usage and continued investigating ways to make our church more energy-efficient.
- Monitored water softener operation and salt usage.
- Worked with Pastor Denise to rearrange pews in sanctuary.
- Secured railings on steps in our narthex.
- Installed new part on our power washer.
- Fluorescent fixtures in our Church House, Kitchen, and Office areas have been converted to LED lighting (contractor was Ed Rhodes).
- Reorganized south basement storage area resulting in safer and more efficient use of this space and improved storage and access to tools and equipment.
- Installed new closer mechanism on Church Street outer door.
- Began looking at ways to increase involvement of scouts and leaders from Troop #87 in the life of our church.
- Our Snow Shoveling Team worked to keep our parking lots and walkways cleared of snow and ice.
- Committee members set up before (and cleaned up after) Pancake Breakfasts, Wednesday evening Suppers, and other church events.
- Property members periodically check our flat roof to make sure that drains are free of debris.
- Volunteers from our Property Committee clean our sanctuary, restrooms, kitchen, offices, and social areas
  each week. Additional help is always welcome (see Sheila French).
- Each month we give continued attention to our list of scheduled maintenance items.

The Property Committee would like to give a special thank you to **Pat Fitzgerald** for his many years of dedicated service as our leader! Pat stepped down from his role at the beginning of January. **Mary Churchill** is our new chairperson.
