PROPERTY COMMITTEE UPDATE

The work of our Property Committee continues during these very unusual times. Recent items of concern and progress include:

- Mother Nature toppled our sign during the high winds on April 10th. By the grace of God, the sign itself was not damaged and still works; the wooden casings for the sign broke off at the base posts. Steve Johnston, Scott French, and others brought the intact sign and casement into the Narthex for safe keeping. Steve and Scott are mulling over a sturdier base design to reinstall the sign when appropriate. This project will take priority when church activity resumes.
- Water softener: We are monitoring salt usage and coordinating our efforts with Chemung Soft Water. With monthly usage of 100 lbs. of salt, we will have to supplement bimonthly delivery with our own purchases.
- Gas usage: With cool weather persisting and no occupancy, the temperature settings in the library and sanctuary have been turned down to 58 degrees.
- Annual building inspection certificate: Receipt of the certificate is delayed as Big Flats town staff is cut back to a skeleton crew. The inspector assured us that the date of completion would reflect correctly on the certificate.
- Water department inquiry: Our Town of Big Flats Water Department asked if we were using an unusual amount of
 water. This does not appear to be the case as evidenced by our water bills which do not indicate higher than
 normal usage. No further inquiry has been made by the town water department. With no church activity, water
 usage should remain at the quarterly minimum.
- Annual town debris pick-up: Masked, gloved and socially distanced, a work crew gathered on April 6th to clean up the Welles property and church lawns/gardens of leaves, branches and sticks to prepare for mowing season and town pick-up. Thank you to **Jenny Dean, Kathy Johnston, Mary Churchill, Tom Seem, Bill Howells, Sheila and Scott French** for joining the fun.
- Monthly inspections: On 4/15, again masked, gloved and socially distanced, members of The Second Story Gang (Scott, Mary, and Bill) were pleasantly surprised to find the flat roof virtually clear of any debris. The sanctuary cellar also remains moisture and worry free. The winter coverings were removed from the foundation windows to allow for ventilation. Both sump pumps were dry. A quick walk through the facility found no apparent problems.
- On Thursday, April 30, the Property Committee met online via ZOOM to discuss plans for the eventual reopening of our church and the resumption of activities win our church building.

MARCH AND APRIL FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

While the Pantry had to close for one week in March to re-tool the delivery process, we have been successful continuing to supply our neighbors with food. Horseheads Pantry unfortunately had to close. We understand their challenge of staying open; we completely changed our working staff as they were all high risk and needed to shelter in place. Now-adays we keep all the canned food in the church house and bag everything up ahead then place the food in the trunks of people's cars as they come to our Drive-thru Pantry. The shelves up in the pantry are actually bare. We have a schedule to ensure that we never have more than 3 people in the church house from receiving food orders to closing and maintain 6 foot social distancing at all times. We ask for your help and understanding to please avoid coming into the church on Tuesdays from 9:30 to 3pm as we would like to eliminate any interaction with anyone.

We are delighted that people instinctively want to help those in need and we have received help from many of our Big Flats Community of Faith. We regularly get farm fresh eggs from **Pastor Denise and Valerie** and continue to receive anonymous donations of canned goods. We have received a large financial donation from the Methodist and from the Horseheads Lutheran churches. We were able to give out small bottles of shampoo and soap thanks to **Betsy Doan and Alissa Jolley** made masks for our working volunteers. **Ann Hayes** quickly made over 60 masks to hand out to our neighbors who had none. Shared Blessings delivered a smile by providing some comfort food (cake mix, icing, chocolate) as well as much needed tissues and cat & dog food. **Bill and Barb Powell** provided canned beef stew and Ravioli, which are always appreciated items. **Ann Slowik** made masks and provided some much needed clipboards. The Higher Hope church has reached out to us for the first time and provided cake mixes and masks.

Every week we get deliveries from Minier's and Bimbo Bread and **Ed Rhodes** brings us a Food Bank order. Currently, the Food Bank is providing a great selection of free Federal canned goods and meat, some donated food items and have also provided new food grants for Food Bank purchases (including one sponsored by Amazon). I am grateful that **Therese White, Allison Burrell and Dan Jolley** are preforming the hands-on jobs of helping our neighbors, who are facing food insecurities in these uncertain times. With everyone's help in the community, we are keeping the wheels on and moving forward.
