A number of "behind the scenes" projects take place each month at our church. Some of the work done in September included:

- Our committee continues to follow a monthly and seasonal schedule of maintaining our facilities and making improvements that add to the safety, energy efficiency, and attractiveness of our church building and its grounds.
- Our lawns get weekly attention from Scott and Sheila French, and Pat Fitzgerald works to keep our mulched beds free of weeds.
- A special thank you to Pat Seem for the lovely fall decorations that grace our front door!
- Repairs were made to a number of seams on the rubberized roof over our Church House. Thanks go to Steve Johnston, Brett Barney, and Jeremy Barney!
- We are in hopes that our annual problem with (annoying, but, fortunately, harmless!) box elder beetles will
  be greatly alleviated this coming winter thanks to a preventative spray treatment applied by **Pest**Solutions, of Horseheads.
- Pat Fitzgerald reports that our boiler system passed its required safety inspection on September 16.
- Our committee has been able to replace our current office copier with an updated model at a greatly reduced cost. Sheila French, our liaison with the machine supplier, deserves a big thank you for her diligence and negotiating skills! The new machine will be installed in October.
- Our St. Pauley used clothing shed has, at times, been filled to overflowing. We have been in contact with the St. Pauley organization to ensure that pickups will be made more frequently. Special thanks go to all those volunteers who work each month to keep our collection shed in good order.


